Review of the collective monograph "Development of Modern Art and Pedagogical **Education: National and European Context**" (Nellia Nychkalo, Larysa Lukianova, Heorhii Filipchuk, Oksana Komarovska, and others; Foreword by Stefan Purici. Edited by Myroslava Vovk. Suceava, 2023)

In the context of Eurointegration changes in the modern scientific and educational sphere, the issue of reformative transformations in the field of pedagogical education is becoming increasingly relevant. This is driven by the establishment of higher education standards in the preparation of the modern teacher. Consequently, there is a growing need to study the best European achievements and preserve valuable national experience in teacher training. Therefore, the professional dialogue between the Ukrainian and foreign scholars and educators is crucial for the exchange of high-quality practices in pedagogical education, which should be facilitated within the publishing space.

The idea behind creating the collective monograph "Development of Modern Art and Pedagogical Education: National and European Context" was to present the experience and innovations in the training of art teachers. It aimed
